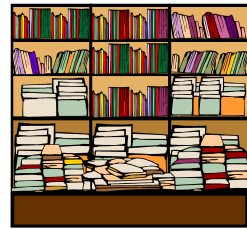


Library News TERM 3



In library classes the children will acquire different knowledge, skills and practices using a variety of learning strategies.

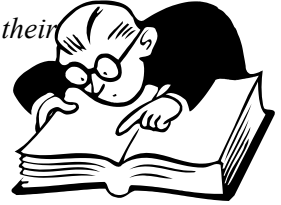
Children will be engaging with and responding to literature.

Library Lesson outlines are as follows:

Prep

Focus: Ordering events, character's speaking and repeating words in stories.

Year One and Two

Focus: Vocabulary and character's behaviours in a story.

Year Three and Four

Focus: Author's message, facts in stories and events.

Year Five and Six

Focus: Research facts, subject specific vocabulary and higher order thinking.
