The students are encouraged to actively participate in Music, Dance, Drama and Media Studies.

Program Outline for Term 1.

Teacher – Emilia Rio-Scaddan

**Foundation – An introduction to Music through singing, dance and instrumental work.
Focus on music elements - beat, rhythm & pitch.**

**Grade 1 – Introduction of new action songs – exploring singing voices / pitch / melodies
Listening and responding to pitch and melody through games and instruments.**

**Grade 2 – Introduction of new action songs using body percussion and instruments.
Focus on music elements – rhythm, melody & form.**

**Grade 3 - Introduction to formal music notation (theory) music reading and playing.
Introduction to the recorder – background of instrument, correct posture, fingering and sound production.
Singing – introduction of new songs focusing on melody lines and singing in rounds (harmony).**

**Grade 4 – Music Theory – time signatures, note values, bar lines, music terms etc.
Music reading and playing (notation)
Continuation of recorder work - revising correct posture, fingering and sound production. Introduction of music pieces with new notes.
Preparation for our ANZAC Ceremony.**

**Grade 5/6 - Chart reading and playing using different music genres e.g. latin, classical etc.
Music notation further developed using recorder and tuned instruments.
Listening games – focused on music elements i.e. tempo, rhythm and pitch etc.
Singing – vocal training and the introduction of new songs.**

Grade 6 - **Media/Drama **Teacher - Mike Harris**
Students will rehearse and perform a play. They will develop understandings of theatre and the dramatic arts.**
